

Autumn visit to Stamford and Burghley House

Saturday 28 September 2019



Sir Walter Scott called **Stamford** "the finest stone town in England." It was first to designate a Conservation Area in the town in 1967, the first in the country. It has over 600 listed buildings of mellow limestone in the town centre including five medieval churches, all real gems.

In the afternoon we move to **Burghley House** one of England's greatest houses designed by William Cecil, Lord High Treasurer to Queen Elizabeth 1. The gardens and

parkland were largely designed by Capability Brown in the 18th century.

08.00 (prompt!) departure from **Chime Square** with Theobalds Coaches (Executive coach with facilities).

10.00 (approx) arrive at Stamford coach station. Time to explore 10 00 - 2 00.

14.00 Depart for Burghley House. Free time at Burghley. A self guided tour using an audio guide (£3:00 to hire) takes 1hr 15mins.

17.30 (prompt!) Depart Burghley for St Albans.

19.30 (approx) arrive St Albans.
